One of the greatest benefits of having a Project Manager, is the assurance that the project will stay on schedule. Having a Project Manager will insure that your renovation will actually have a start and finish date. The Project Manager is responsible for scheduling all of the sub-contractors and keeping the project moving forward, and not stalling due to mismanaged coordination.
